

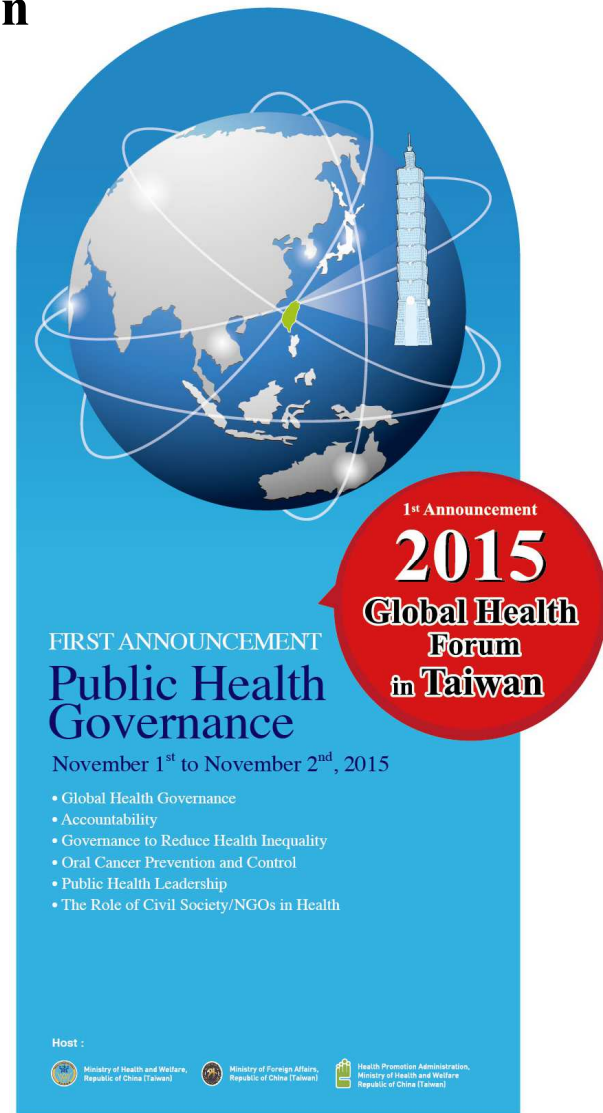
2015 Global Health Forum in Taiwan
